

FOREWORD

The principal task of the competence approach is to develop student's ability for independent study in the process of training and in the future professional activity. Educational testing is supposed to carry out this task, aimed at forming demand for self-analysis, self-control and self-development. Educational testing is also directed at outlining and determining the depth, volume, structure, content and hierarchy of knowledge and skills.

The collection of the tests on Linguocountrystudy of the USA is aimed at acquainting students with modern reality, culture and history of the USA, rather than checking their level of the linguocountrystudy competence. Thence, its aim is educational rather than evaluative. Since modern educational process shifts accents onto independent study instead of using prepared material, learning instead of teaching, the tests may serve as a guideline for students in their work. The test questions are to show them the direction in studying the subject, issues to pay attention to, realia essential for effective communication, words and idioms currently used in the language.

The educational principle of the tests provides the quality of studying the discipline (improves the fullness, depth and accuracy of knowledge); helps form the idea of the topic within the shortest time span; outlines the main issues and directions in studying material. This approach is also instrumental in developing students' independent cognitive activity, ability of self-control and self-evaluation.

As a corollary, the tests may be used not only on the stage of revision and consolidation of material, but on the propaedeutic and motivating one.

The tests are meant for self-study and preparation of students for seminars, the final test and exam. The content of the collection is elaborated according to the content of the program of the discipline "Linguocountrystudy" for the second-year students of the South Ukrainian National Pedagogical University named after K. D. Ushinsky and comprises eight parts organizing and assessing knowledge on such topics as US history, geography, government, education, religion, holidays, mentality, population and languages of the country. The booklet also suggests keys to each topic block for students to assess own progress.

Each thematic set of tests comprises factual material, important non-equivalent, background, connotative lexis, linguoculturemes and idioms – all that make up the subject matter of Linguocountrystudies, that provides effective intercultural communication and develops communicative competence of future teaches.

The tests may be recommended for students to get ready for the seminar, prepare for the lecture, revise for the tests and exams; for the teachers to evaluate students' achievements, select questions for intermediate tests, construct final test on the basis of the questions offered.
